- Hole # 9: Replaced 2 basins and added 150' drain line
- Hole # 12: Repaired 2 sinking 12" drain basins
- Hole # 13: Replaced top part of 12" basin connected to an 8" T connection

 - Recipient provides project-based employees
 - FTE Formula 1,680 hours worked per year (at least 35 hours per week for at least 48 weeks per year)



Overview

- DIP is a matching grant program to provide support to small businesses located within the boundaries of the SGAs, SEGAs, SFAs, Council-adopted districts, or any valid business associations in the City of Virginia Beach
- Funding is for impactful building improvements, modernization, and capital expenditures that meet the goals of the designated district
- 47 total DIP applications received between February 22 – March 31, 2021
- First (7) advanced at VBDA's April 20, 2021 Meeting totaling \$62,257 in grants and \$180,180 in private investment
- (2) more advanced at VBDA's May 18th, 2021
 Meeting totaling \$22,100 in grants and \$53,500 in private investment
